This week we are going to be revising skills previously learnt before lockdown.

	<u>Spellings</u>	<u>Maths</u>	<u>Reading</u>	<u>Writing</u>
<u>Monday</u> <u>15.3.21</u>	Choose 10 words from the spellings list each day. Practice reading and spelling them.	Answer the place value questions. Think carefully about the value of each digit! Tip: Remember, when using the inequality sign (< and >), the crocodile eats the biggest number! E.g. $25 < 46$ $87 > 21$	Read ‘Max and Margot’. Talk about the text with someone in your house. Answer questions 1-4 about it.	Complete the adjectives activity sheets. Remember, an adjective is a word that describes a noun. E.g. <u>red</u> coat <u>old</u> castle <u>tall</u> giraffe.
<u>Tuesday</u> <u>16.3.21</u>		Answer the place value questions. You might find it useful to use these online arrow (place value) cards to help you with your work: https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/61/itp-place-value	Read ‘Max and Margot’ again. Answer questions 5-9.	Complete the activity about verbs. Remember, a verb is an action or ‘doing’ word – e.g. He jumped high. Sally whispers quietly.
<u>Wednesday</u> <u>17.3.21</u>		Answer the addition and subtraction questions. If you get stuck, use the number square on the next page to help you.	Read ‘Max and Margot’ again. What do you imagine, when you read the story? Draw a picture of what it makes you think about. E.g. You might draw a picture of the flat nest, Margot looking at the mice, the birds in the sky etc. Write labels to explain what you have drawn.	Complete the activity about conjunctions. Remember, a conjunction joins ideas together in a sentence. E.g. Khadija was late for school because she stayed in bed for too long.
<u>Thursday</u> <u>18.3.21</u>		Solve the ‘Marvellous Milkshakes’ problem. You have to find 2 ways of making the amounts of money shown. There is a coins word and picture mat on the next page if you need help with what coins you could use.	Choose a book to read on Bug Club. Answer the questions about it.	Read the ‘Introduction to inverted commas’. Then rewrite the conversation between the magic mirror and the wicked Queen using inverted commas.
<u>Friday</u> <u>19.3.21</u>		Complete a spelling test using the words that you have been practicing this week.	Add the amounts of money in each box. Remember, we write the amount of pounds before the decimal point, and the pence after. So £2.40 = 2 pounds and 40 pence.	Complete the grammar mats all about what you have learnt at school!
