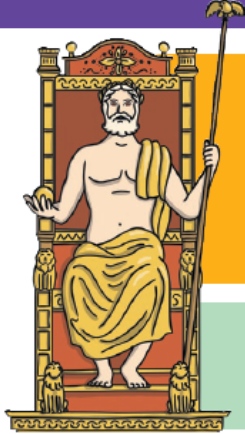

People have been celebrating in lots of different ways:




Lots of people stand outside their homes to clap every Thursday.

Some people have even used pots and pans to make lots of noise.

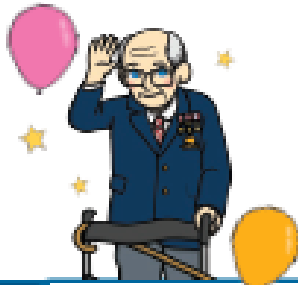
Many children have put up rainbow pictures in their windows.
