Practice the 'ar' sound using the video: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8vAAxD-53q0 Read and discuss the story 'Barker' using the PowerPoint.	Read the poem 'Winter's when'. This is a Kenning - a poem with 2 words on each line (a noun and a verb). Write your own Kenning, called 'Christmas is when'. Use the word bank to help you.
<u>Wednesday</u> <u>9.12.20</u>	Complete the 'word changers' activity.	Divide each shape into quarters. Then solve the word problems. Extra challenge: can you complete the 'think' question?	Reread the story 'Barker'. Answer the questions about it.	Read the examples of acrostic poems using the PowerPoint. Remember, an acrostic poem is one where a word is spelt out down the side. Write your own acrostic poem about Christmas using the template. Use the word bank to help you.
<u>Thursday</u> <u>10.12.20</u>	Play 'four in a row' with someone else in your house. Can you spell the 'tion' words correctly?	Find $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of different amounts. Use the pictures to help you. Then try the 'think' question.	Choose a book to read on Bug Club. Answer the questions about it.	Read the Haiku poems using the PowerPoint. A Haiku is a Japanese type of poem that has 17 syllables in all. You can find out more about what a syllable is by looking at the Syllables PowerPoint. Haikus follow very strict rules- there are 3 lines all together. The first line has 5 syllables; the second line has 7 and the third line has 5. Your task is to create your own Haiku about either Christmas, or Winter. Use the word bank to help you.
