

LC – Can I decide where best to build a city?

Activity 1

You are an **early settler** before the times of nice homes with running water and heating. During the times of early settlement, there was no electricity, cars, machinery or anything modern at all. What **natural** factors would influence where you would build your **settlement**?

Thinking questions:

There is no running water, bricks, internet, electricity etc.

- Where are you going to get water from? Think...nearby lake or river?
- Where are you going to get heat for cooking and keeping warm? How would you make a fire? Remember no gas!
- Where are you going to get building materials? Remember there were no bricks in those days!!!
- What does the land need to be like to build on? Would you need to build on flat or rocky land? Think of a stable foundation.
- How are you going to get food? Think....what lives in a forest or lake/river you could eat? What grows in a forest that could make a tasty treat?

Now read this example and write your reasons:

Example: Building materials - I would consider building my house where I can find materials to build it. I would like to be near a rocky hillside so that I use stone to build my house.
