Key Historical Dates

The Vikings invade Lindisfarne: 793 AD

The Mayans build Chichen Itza: around 700AD

The Romans leave Britain: 410 AD

Leif Ericsson reaches North America 1000AD

Christopher Columbus reaches America, starting European colonisation: 1492 AD

The Tudors rule England: 1485AD – 1603AD

William the Conqueror and the Normans invade England: 1066 AD

Death of the Prophet Mohammed: 632 AD

Start of the Abbasid Caliphate 758 AD

Baghdad is destroyed by the Mongols. End of the Abbasid Caliphate 1258 AD
