When you are completing the sheet, remember to count how many parts there are altogether (denominator) and then count how many of them are shaded (numerator).</p>	<p><u>Guided Reading</u> Read the text. Underline any vocabulary you do not understand and use a dictionary to find the meaning.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> Listen to the story The Jolly Christmas Postman using the link at the bottom of the page. Look up any words you do not understand.</p>	<p><u>Spellings:</u>  On the website - practice them each day.  Look up the meaning of any words you do not understand.</p>	<p><u>Topic</u> Today you are going to create your fantastic finish! This is where you show everything you have learnt this half term about the Victorians. You can present your work in any way you want. You may create a poster, presentation, leaflet, etc.</p>

<p><b>Wednesday</b></p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Today you are going to be investigating which numbers up to 60 can be split into both thirds and quarters. Remember to write the number sentence (1/3 of 21 is 7). Remember to use your division facts to help you.</p>	<p><u>Guided Reading</u> Look at the questions and highlight the answers in the text.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> Have a look at the example of a diary entry. Have a look at the checklist which shows you the key features you must include when writing a diary entry.  Over the next few lessons, you are going to be writing a diary entry in the role of the Jolly Christmas Postman.</p>		<p><u>French</u> Have a go at sounding out the French alphabet. <u>Computing</u> Try some of the computing activities on Purple Mash. <u>PE</u> Have 15 minutes of exercise - this may be having a walk around the house.</p>
