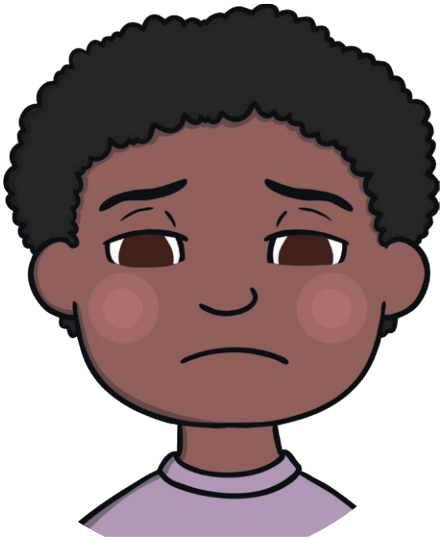


Anti-Bullying Week



What Is Anti-Bullying Week?

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual event. It tells people about bullying and ways they can help stop it happening. This year, it is between Monday 16th November and Friday 20th November 2020. The theme is 'United Against Bullying'.

What is Bullying?

- Bullying is hurting someone more than once. It is not a mistake.
- Bullying can hurt someone's feelings or their body.
- Hurting someone on the outside - pushing, pinching, hitting or kicking them or taking or breaking their things more than once.
- Hurting someone on the inside - name-calling or teasing them more than once.



Where Does Bullying Happen?

Bullying can happen in the classroom, on the playground or on the field. Bullying can also happen when playing outside after school or playing an online game with people you know after school.



United Against Bullying

This year's Anti-Bullying Week theme is 'United Against Bullying'. There are lots of people that can help stop bullying and everyone needs to help this happen. Together, we are united against bullying.

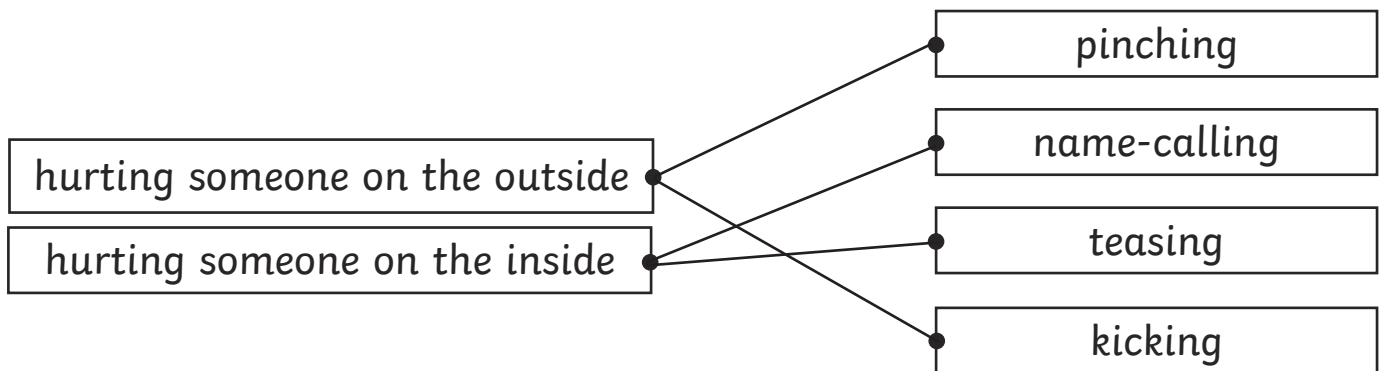
