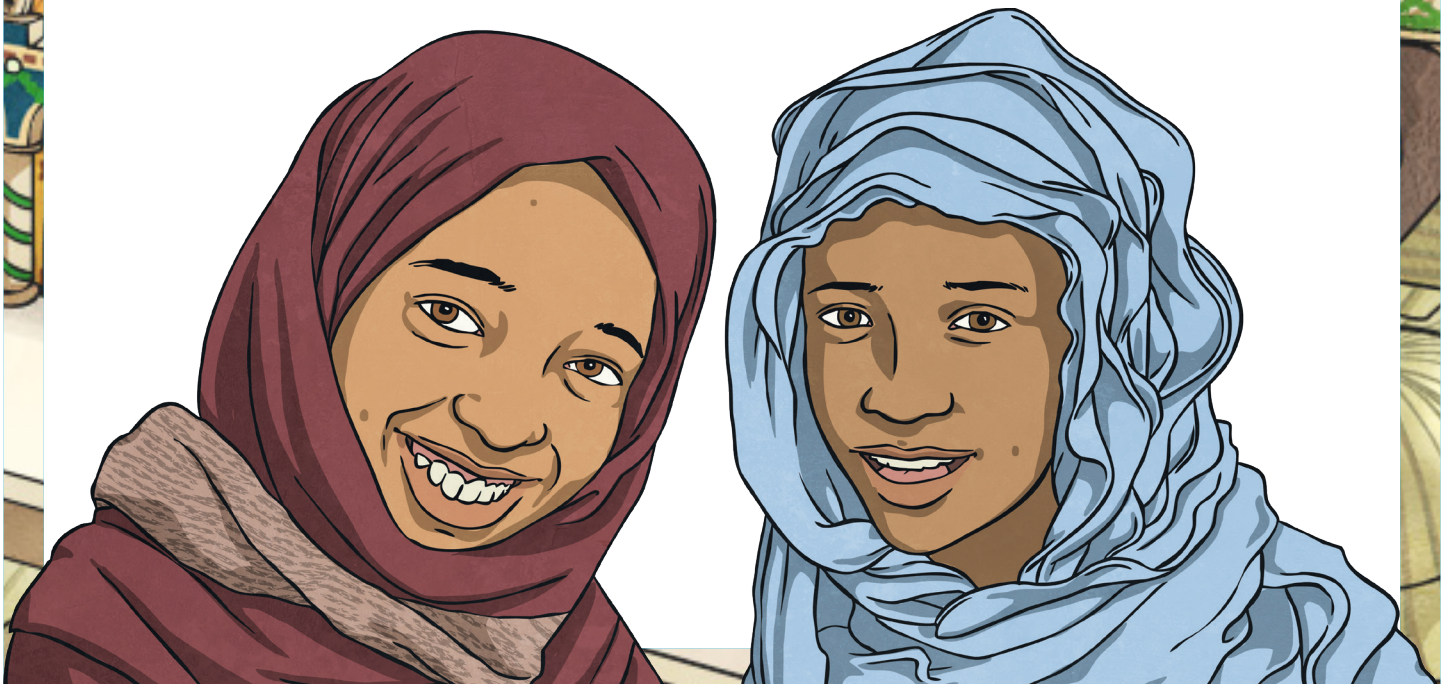
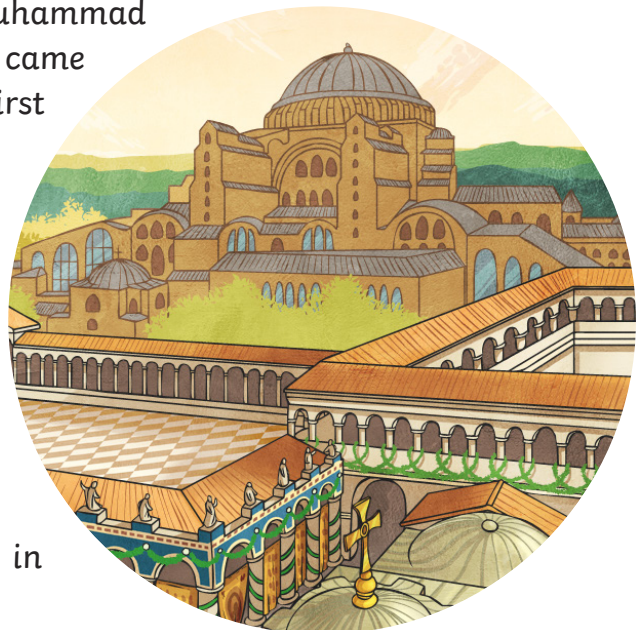

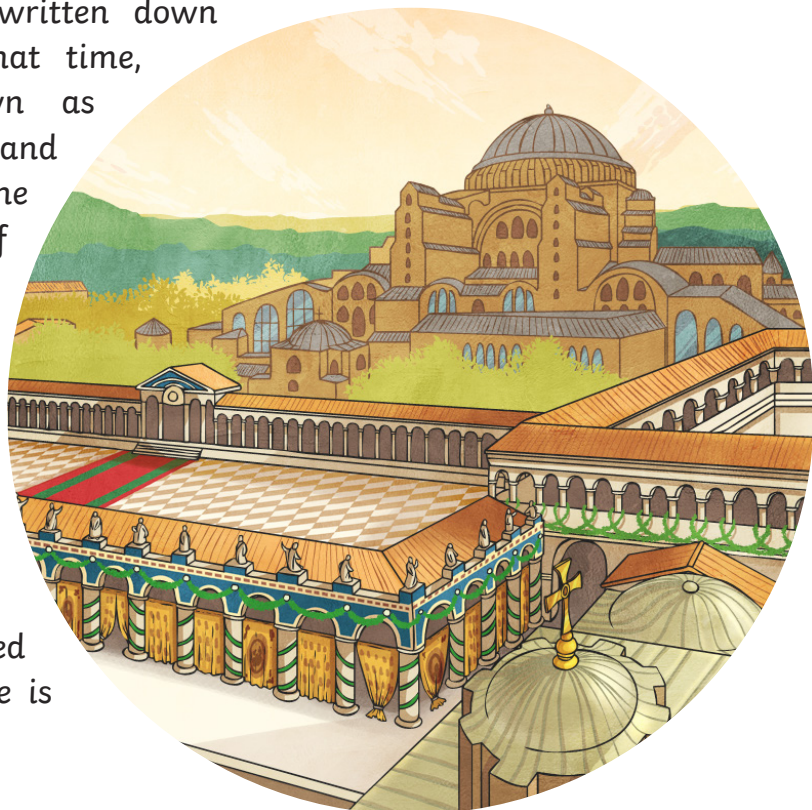

People who follow Islam are known as Muslims. Muslims believe that Islam has always existed and was revealed to them through a number of people called prophets. It is believed that the last prophet was Muhammad.

The Qur'an, which is written in Arabic, is the scripture of Islam. Muslims believe it was revealed by God to a number of prophets and that it is the word of God. It provides guidance to teach people right and wrong. Anyone who handles or touches the Qur'an has to follow certain rules. They must be clean and wash in special ways called ablutions. People who are not Muslim cannot touch the Qur'an.

Muhammad was born in Mecca in Saudi Arabia in the year AD 570. He worked as a merchant and became known for his honesty. He was a deeply spiritual person and would often meditate on Mount Hira.

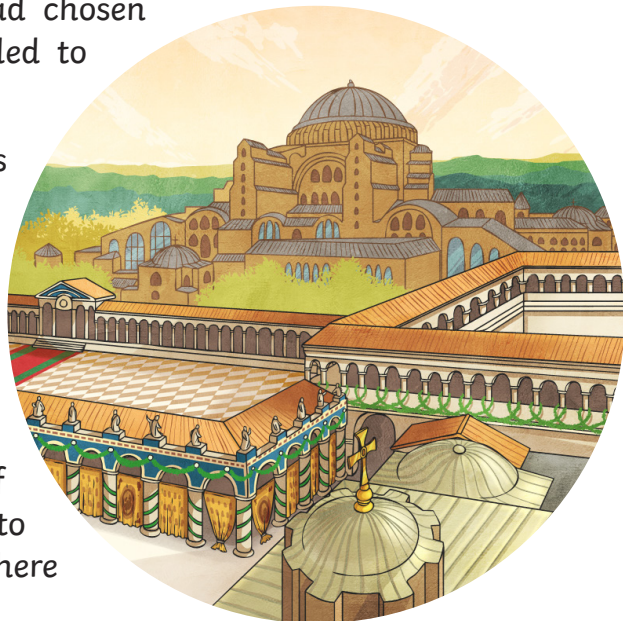
In AD 610, he was meditating in a cave on Mount Hira when the Angel Gabriel appeared to him. The angel told him to speak aloud or recite. The angel said the word 'Allah' and Muhammad began to recite words which he believed came straight from God. This was his first revelation from God.

Over the next 22 years, Muhammad received revelations from God. These revelations were written down as the Qur'an. From that time, Muhammad was known as Prophet Muhammad and he preached about the revelations for the rest of his life. He is recognised as the founder of Islam.

Prophet Muhammad believed God had chosen him to preach what had been revealed to him and tell the world.

The principle message is that there is no God but Allah and that life should be lived in submission to Allah.

Prophet Muhammad died in AD 632 in Medina. He is buried there. He is recognised as being the last prophet of Islam. Many Muslims travel on pilgrimages to the birth place of Muhammad as a sign of respect and to pray. Many also travel to Medina, where he died.

Answers

1. How would you describe how Muslims view God?

Any answer which includes reference to God being merciful, powerful and unique; that God can be called upon at a time of distress.

2. In your own words, explain what the Qur'an is.

Answers that include reference to the Qur'an being the religious scripture of Islam; that it is the word of God and teaches people right from wrong; that it is written in Arabic and revealed to Prophet Muhammad.

3. Why do you think there are rules about handling the Qur'an?

Answers that include: showing respect; it is a holy book; it is a religious scripture and is valuable to people.

4. Who was Muhammad?

Muhammad was the final prophet of Islam who had the Qur'an revealed to him. He was born in AD 570 in Mecca and worked as a merchant.

5. What does 'revelation' mean?

Revelation means that something important is revealed. In this case, it is of a divine nature which relates to humans and their lives.

6. How was the Qur'an revealed to Muhammad?

The Qur'an was revealed to Muhammad by the Angel Gabriel appearing to him in a cave on Mount Hira. The angel told Muhammad to recite and Muhammad began reciting the words from God.

7. How did the revelation of the Qur'an affect Muhammad's life?

Muhammad began preaching what had been revealed to him and became known as a prophet.

8. Describe a pilgrimage you might want to make. It could be for anything that means something to you.
