Ancient Greece

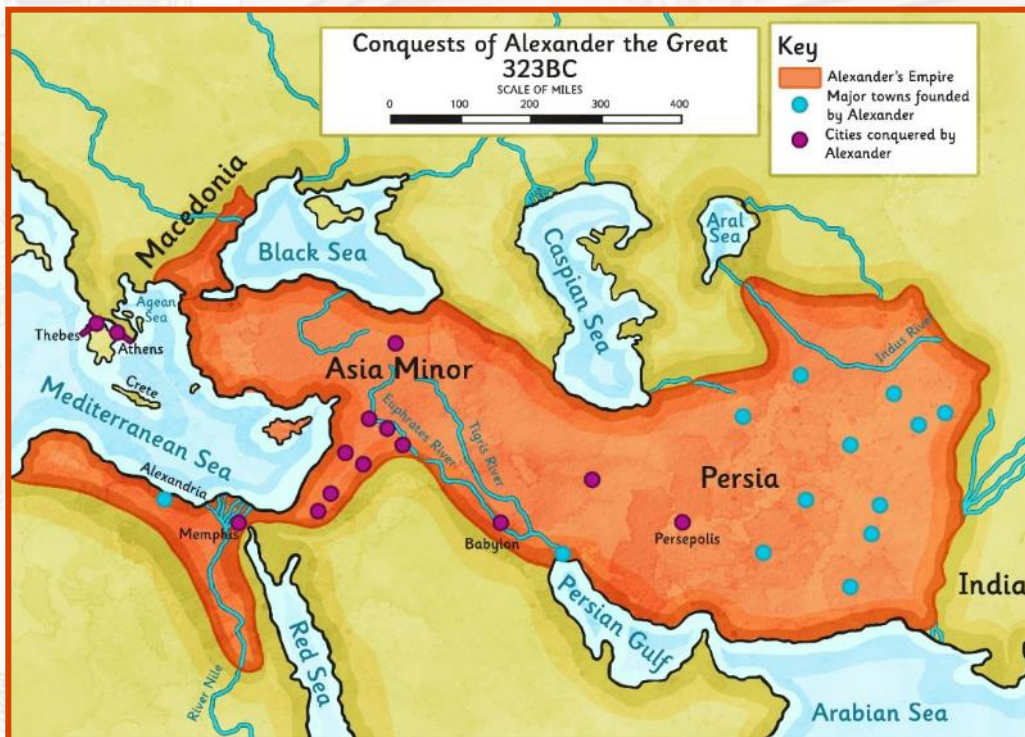

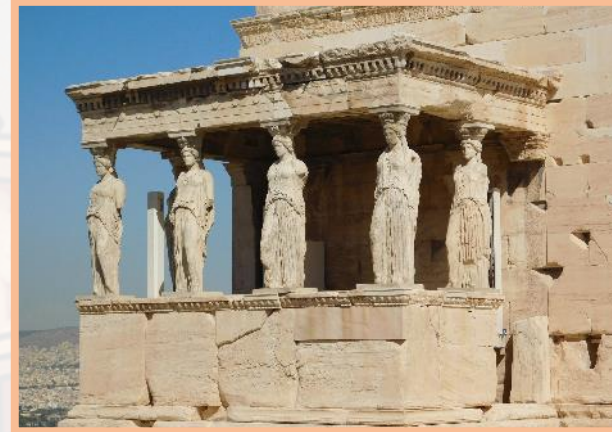

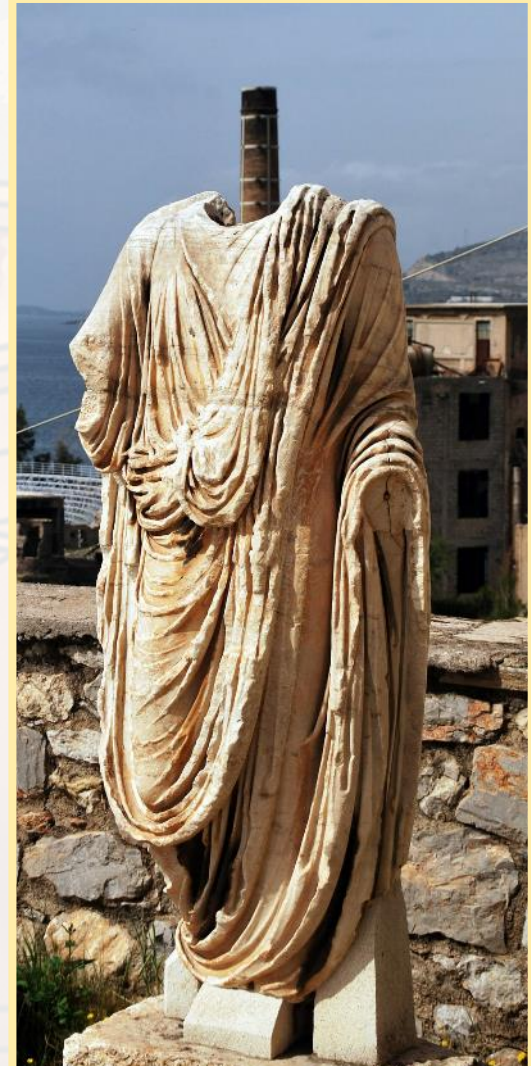

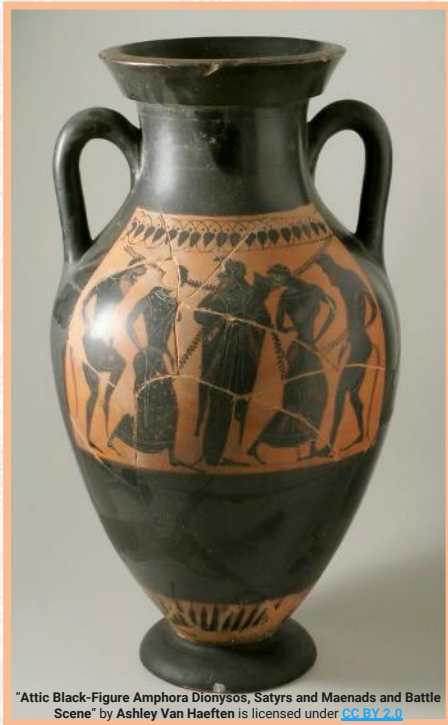

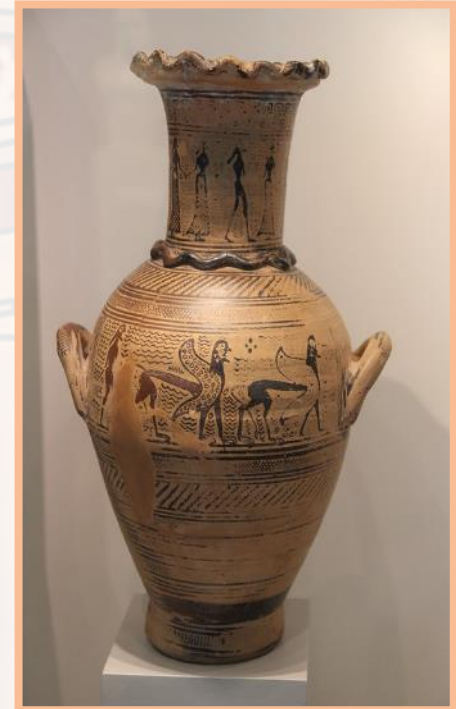
