

Think and Write: Surfing the Waves



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Use this photograph as your inspiration to **think** and **write**. Use the following pattern of sentences:

Sentence 1 Must contain the verb 'surf' in the perfect present tense.

Sentence 2 Must begin with a fronted adverbial.

Sentence 3 Needs to include an expanded noun phrase.

Sentence 4 Must contain a word beginning with the prefix un-.

Sentence 5 Needs to contain the subordinating conjunction 'before'.

Ask your partner to read through your passage carefully
– does it include everything we are looking for?



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Example Answers

Surfing the Waves



Here's an example of what you could have **thought** and **written**...

perfect present tense

fronted adverbial

Jamie **has surfed** on Australia's Gold Coast for many years. **As the sun sets**, he paddles

expanded noun phrase

against the waves and away from the shore. The **strong, forceful** wind hammers

prefix -un

against the **stiff, plastic** sail, dragging him to and fro. **Unbelievably**, Jamie has learned

conjunction 'before'

to control his board with ease. He always makes sure to return to shore **before** sunset.
